Treasurer's Blog - October 2010 Results through September 2010



Total Income:

Here is a breakdown of our total income for 9 months into 2010:

Our envelope giving (both pledged and unpledged) is still behind the target for nine months into 2010. However, our Special offerings are slightly higher than target. On a positive note, we haven't budgeted for a deficit this year.

Total expenses:

Here is a recap of our total expenses for 9 months into 2010.

Our awareness of keeping expenses in check across the board is reflected in our totals for three quarters of the year.

How are we doing so far?

Looking at our income through October 24th, we've fallen a little further behind target in our envelope giving (\$162,048 target vs. \$155,205 actual). The actual giving for October has not been as good as our estimate for those four weeks. Envelope giving is made up of pledges (that income which we can expect on a regular basis) and unpledged giving (that which comes from parishioners who give their offering when they are in attendance). After review for 43 weeks of 2010, it is mostly the unpledged amounts that we budgeted for which have fallen behind our expectations. Thanks to all of you for keeping your pledges up to date and please keep doing so as we begin the final two months of 2010.

Holly Fair 2010

Just a reminder that the 2010 Holly Fair is getting closer. On December 4th, the church parish hall, choir room, and Sunday school rooms will be transformed into a holiday bazaar with wonderful food, music, decorations, poinsettias, and lots of things for sale. Please keep your schedules clear for Dec. 4th as we need lots of help to make the event a success.

The first tenth (a tithe) of our proceeds go to local charities, with the next \$3,000 going towards our capital loan. There will be much more info coming out in the Sunday bulletins and the weekly tri-folds over the next month. Also, please fill out and return the sign-up sheets that are being distributed in the Crook or the Sunday bulletins as it is most necessary for our event planning.

If you have items for the "\$" store, you may drop them off on Saturday night or Sunday mornings in the back of the church, or during office hours (Mon-Thur, 9-2) at the upper level of the office wing on the desk outside the new chapel.
