Last year the Scholarship Committee revived an old Good Shepherd tradition – The Annual Progressive Dinner. It was a huge success! We had 47 attendees and raised almost \$1000 for the Scholarship Fund. Not only did we have a wonderful time, we met some new friends and learned more about fellow parish members. This year the date is Saturday, May 14 and sign ups are under way in the parish hall.

In case you missed it last year – here is how it works:

Everyone will come together at 6:30 PM for a social hour at someone’s home. We will divide into 2 homes if we have a large enough group. The person (or persons) who host the social hour will be given supplies and wine.

From there we will each be assigned a home to go to for dinner. Each dinner host will be given the recipe and supplies for the main course – an easy chicken dish. Again, depending on the numbers, we will need several hosts for dinner.

Finally, we will all meet back at the Church for coffee and dessert. We need two hosts to set up for this.

Everyone will be asked to bring a dish to share at one of the events. Your host will let you know whether you will bring an appetizer, side dish or dessert.
